- After governing documents submitted, Form 1023 filed with IRS










E-Bikes & Motorized Vehicles

- Prevalent in all four Villages on VDOT trails, streets, Conservancy trails, BMX course
 - Safety, liability, trail damage
- LCSO shared that enforcement for police is very challenging since there is no Virginia law regulating or banning e-bikes
 - E-bikes divided into three classes from pedal assisted to motor/gas assisted. All allowed by VA law
 - LCSO can enforce helmet and age restrictions
 - Non-pedal e-bikes and gas/diesel bikes are regulated (streets only)

Signage

- **Existing** 20 12" x 18' signs and 50 4" x 4" trail post signs posted throughout the trails
- New plan is to add 24 additional 12" x 18" signs at all trailheads and specific high traffic points of entry (8 weeks away) – Temporary Signs planned for short term

Enforcement

- Residents using gas/motor powered on trails Open Space Violation
- Non-residents could be charged with trespass




Morrisville to Wishing Star Transmission Line

- Dominion Energy recently added alternative routes to its Morrisville to Wishing Star transmission line project
- Original route includes a new 500 kV transmission line primarily on existing ROW by Grange using wreck and rebuild
- Alternate routes will add new transmission lines on new ROW
 - Three routes proposed one impacts The Greens
 - Big concern is that data centers follow transmission lines
- No mailed notice about public input sessions and unfortunately had low attendance
- Supervisor TeKrony requesting Dominion hold another public input session
- HOA & Conservancy working on joint letter and text for residents to use


Morrisville to Wishing Star Transmission Line

- March Financials

March 2025 Financials

- Assessment fees under budget for Q1 2025 since assessed at 2024 rate in Q1.
 Will be made up Q2-Q4.
- 6103 R&M over budget. Boat House improvements which include new appliances for additional storage for BH Farm Stand. Also includes \$2600 emergency septic repair at the Farm.
- 7115 R&M employee housing slightly over budget for the month. \$2k was spent on electric work at Lightridge. \$1400 spent on quarterly septic tank monitoring and maintenance contract.
- 7343 legal fees over budget by about \$2300 as organization considers applying for 501c3 status. Created a new GL code for legal fees specific to 501c3 pursuit moving forward.

April 2025 Financials

- 7115 R&M employee housing over budget. Radon testing/mitigation system installation at Grant Farm House
- 7347 other professional services over budget due to payment for reserve study
- 7457 recruiting over budget. Land Stew Manager job is still posted. Also had posts made for internship
- Firewood revenue below budget since sales are on hold.
- COGs Layer costs up due to raising chicks to meet Egg demand (pullets not available until October). Purchasing supplies for 2 flocks.
- 5160 and 5180 COGs for Farm Stand restocking ahead of May opening.
- Farm revenue is below budget most notably Custom Shares (down 33% compared to last year). Egg shares down, but wait list in place for when new flock starts laying in August.

Endowment Update

- At end of 2024, Endowment was valued at \$1,322,216
- As of 3/31, value of Endowment was \$1,327,994 after a slight decrease in February
- As of 4/30, value of Endowment had risen to \$1,340,359
- As of 6/2, value of Endowment has again risen to \$1,406,412
- Withdraw to cover approved 2024 CapEx still pending as we transition banks from PNC to Bank of Charles Town
