Community Advisory Committee

- 11 residents appointed unanimously by Board in July
 - Karyn Moreland Board Liaison to CAC
 - Ashish Kapoor Board Liaison to Fundraising Advisory Committee
- Held kick-off meeting in September
 - Moving forward as one committee
 - Fundraising will be a working group in CAC
 - Chair: Gene Loughran
- Held second meeting 9/24 and third will be October 27 or 28(budget feedback expected to be key topic of discussion)

Pursuit of 501c3 Status

- Revised Articles of Incorporation "Reinstatement" filed with SCC after 6.10.25 Board Meeting.
- SCC issued Certificate of Restatement in July
- Official 501c3 Application which consists of Form 1023 submitted to IRS in August
- We expect to hear back in Q1 or Q2 of 2026

Updated Reserve Study

- Conservancy retained same firm used by HOA and by the Conservancy in 2021 (Reserve Advisors)
- Contract for them to update our Repair & Replacement Reserve Study
- Removed repairs and improvements already completed and equipment we no longer own
- Added items not included in 2021 study (bridges, dams, fencing, new equipment) so now it aligns more with the HOA Reserve Study
- Final draft expected in October

2026 Budget Process

- Draft budget will be shared with the community in October
- Presented at Joint Board Meeting on October 14
- Listening Session tentatively set for October 22
- Community Advisory Committee will share feedback from CAC members and residents on October 27 or 28
- Next version shared/additional engagement with residents if needed
- Conservancy Board votes on budget at Nov, 5 board meeting
- Shares with HOA Board for their consideration at Nov. 12 board meeting

Amenity Use Guidelines Update

ELECTRIC AND MOTORIZED RECREATION VEHICLES

Proposed new text in red

- ATVs, dirt bikes, golf carts, and similar motorized recreation vehicles are not permitted on Conservancy trails or on Conservancy Open Space, such as meadows and fields.
- E-bikes, E-scooters, E-dirt bikes, and other electric vehicles are not permitted on Conservancy trails or on Conservancy Open Space, such as meadows and fields.
- Race tracks for electric or motorized recreation vehicles may not be constructed in Conservancy Open Space.
- Conservancy Staff are allowed to use ATVs in discharge of their duties.

Dulles South Food Pantry

- New partnership with DSFP to create
 Willowsford Farm Produce Fund
- All funds raised directly benefit DSFP allowing them to purchase produce from Farm at wholesale rates
- Augments DSFP annual produce budget
- Supplements existing donations from Farm (CSA shares, produce, eggs)
- Kick-off fundraiser event Wine Down
 for a Cause October 9th at Farm Stand








County IPMSP Grant ("LIRA Grant")

- County has grants of up to \$50,000 offered in four cycles with first due September 26 for land owners to remove/treat invasive plants
- Evaluated two sites with Blue Ridge PRISM and consultants/arborists
 - Frontage by Grant Family Campsite in The Grant
 - Total came to ~\$25k (would need additional site assessment to expand area)
 - Area near obstacle course in The Greens
 - \$50k would only cover tree removal in one small area
 - With county guidance, decided to reevaluate for Nov deadline

Greens Obstacle Course Site



Operations

- We have hired a full-time Seasonal Ranger.
- Ranger Emily has moved back home to Michigan, but will stay
 with us part time for a couple months which gives us time to
 determine how to best fill the role.
- Still trying to fill Land Stewardship Manager role. We have reassessed job description, candidate selection, etc. We continue to interview candidates.



- Fall maintenance scheduled






Land Stewardship - Programs

- Forestry Management riparian maint.

- Bluebird Nesting Boxes (67 fletched)



Vegetative Survey

- Summer Intern completed surveys of almost 60 meadows
- Collected data of both natives and invasives using Touch GIS mapping tool
- Helps inform treatment of invasives and then helps measure success of restoration

- Fall project completion of the new "Killian's Run" Trail










Land Stewardship – Labor hours (YTD)







Amenities are available for a lower rental fee in 2024 which saw a higher frequency in rentals.

Firewood Sales had minimal advertising in 2024 with a July-Aug hiatus. We will be selling firewood bundles this fall/winter and enter into 2025 with a stronger marketing strategy.

Native Plants were available earlier this spring with an online shopping option. It experienced improved marketing and Sam attended sales events outside of Willowsford.

CapEx Updates

Peach Orchard Tenant House – renovations complete (slightly under budget)

Update on Farm Driveway/Creek Crossing – wetlands report complete and engineer has completed survey (working on recommendations)

Firewood Storage Canopy – should start in October

May-August 2025 Financials

- Transfer fees continue to outperform budget even with slower sales in August.
- No large or unexpected expenses.
- Land Stewardship payroll under budget due to vacant manager position.
- Firewood and amenities revenue has been slowly increasing.
- Firewood bay permit was approved, and project is getting started.
- Farm Revenue trending up with continued strong demand for eggs.
 Andy has kept expenses low.

Endowment & Investment Update

- Endowment withdrawn from brokerage so that it can be invested in a more conservative fund
- Funds expended on 2024 CapEx and funds committed to 2025
 CapEx withdrawn from Endowment
- ~\$960k will be invested as Endowment Fund

Executive Session
